## Electronic Payment of Taxes

# INDIVIDUALS

<u>FEDERAL</u> - Two options to choose from:

EFTPS®:

- Register at least two weeks in advance of when a payment is due at <u>EFTPS</u>. The IRS mails you your password. Call 1-800-555-4477 if you lose your password.
- Payments must be initiated no later than 8pm of the day before the due date of your payment.
- Pay by phone option (through EFTPS®) call 1-800-555-3453.

IRS Direct Pay – Individuals only:

- Follow the instructions to make a tax payment from your checking account at <u>IRS Direct Pay</u>.
- Registration is not required. Payment is credited on date submitted, not date debited from your account. Bank account information is required, but not retained after payment is submitted.

## <u>VIRGINIA</u>

- To make payment through a registered account online:
  - Registration is required but is also instantaneous. Go to: <u>Virginia Registered Account</u> <u>Online</u> to both register and login.
  - After login you will have the option to view your history as well as make payment.
- To make a direct debit from your checking account without creating an online account:
  - Form 760-PMT Balance due with tax return Go to: Form 760-PMT
  - Form 760IP Extension payment Go to: Form 760IP
  - Form 760-ES Quarterly tax payment Go to: Form 760ES

### MARYLAND

Register at <u>Maryland Taxes Online Services</u>

- Register at "New to the Service Center?" at the bottom of the screen.
  - Once registered go to <u>Maryland Individual Login</u>
  - After login you will have the option to view your history as well as make payment.

### DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

- Go to: <u>MyTax.DC.gov</u>
- You can set up an account by clicking on the link "Sign-up for MyTax.DC.gov" directly under the Log In section on the right side of the screen.
- You can make a payment without setting up an account by first clicking on the "Make a Payment" option under "Quick Payments" on the left side at the bottom of the screen. Then select "Express Credit/Debit Card Payment" on the next screen. Credit card payments incur a transaction fee, while using ACH Debit will not.
